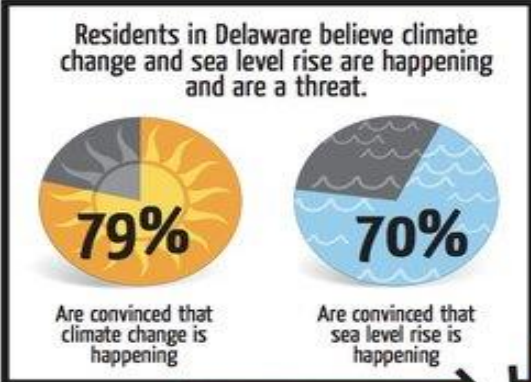




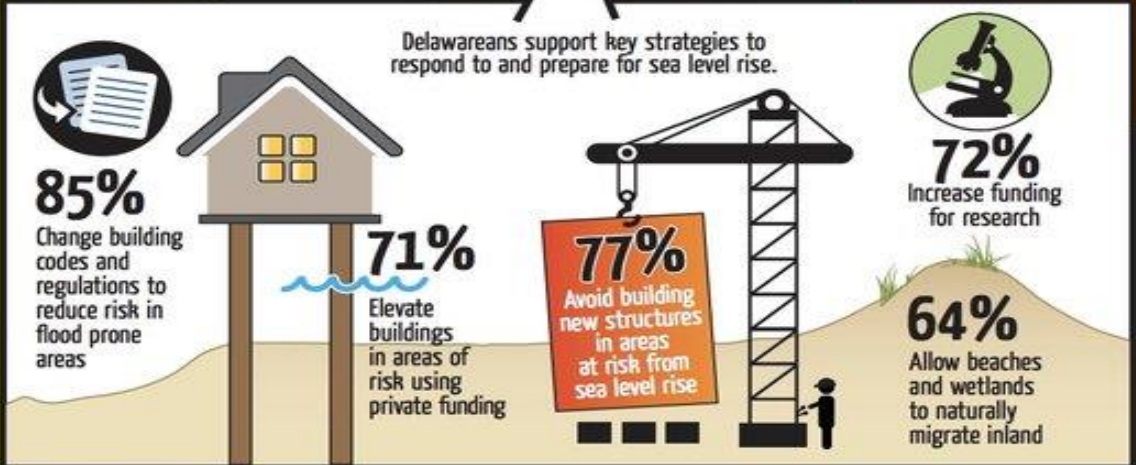
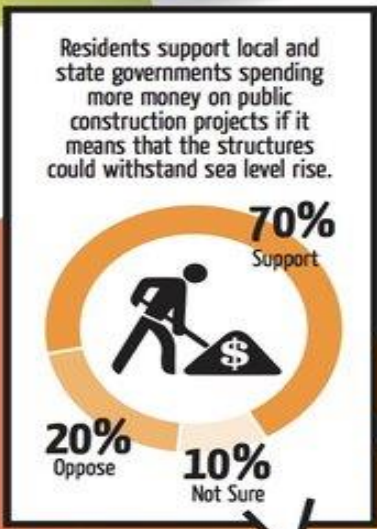
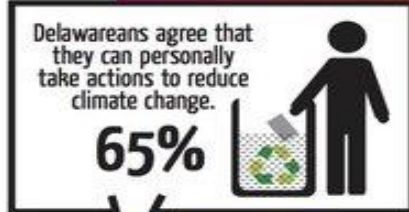
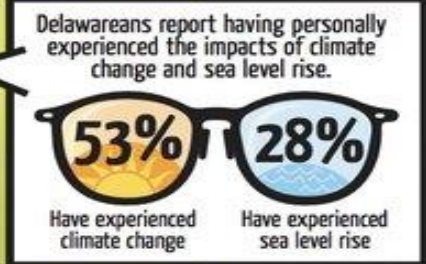
Climate Change and Sea Level Rise:
