The Delaware Resilient and Sustainable Communities League (RASCL) is a collaborative network of state agencies, nonprofits, and academic institutions that convenes partners, leverages limited resources, and coordinates efforts to build a more resilient and sustainable Delaware. RASCL's work is primarily organized around three core issues: climate resilience, sustainable land use and infrastructure, and hazard mitigation and emergency management.

RASCL serves as a forum for member practitioners to collaborate, share best practices, and partner on projects. Our members contribute their time and resources to support information sharing, technical assistance, and networking opportunities for state, local, and county governments, citizen groups, the private sector, and nonprofit organizations to advance resilience and sustainability across the state of Delaware. RASCL remains objective and neutral, does not engage in advocacy, and does not conduct lobbying activities.

RASCL Members Collaborate on Initiatives Including:

- Undertaking special projects, as directed by issue-driven subcommittees, such as
 developing resources and improving coordination across member organizations and
 between agencies and stakeholders.
- Providing technical assistance to communities using RASCL member resources and expertise.
- Hosting the annual RASCL Summit, which brings together community members, elected
 officials, resilience practitioners, nonprofit organizations, and state and federal officials to
 network, learn, and share best practices.
- Organizing RASCL Coffee Hours to explore best practices, emerging topics, new projects, funding opportunities, and more—encouraging dialogue between communities, resilience practitioners, nonprofit organizations, and government officials.
